**01. Nyetimber Classic Cuvee, N. V.**

The signature wine of Nyetimber is a classic blend of Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier and it is a perfect balance of elegance and intensity. The blend includes wines from all their vineyards and from several vintages. The pale golden hue and fine bubbles make their flagship Classic Cuvee Multi-Vintage the ideal occasion-ready drink – whether it's toasting a big birthday or simply finishing a busy week. Following extensive ageing in their cellar (usually more than three years), their Classic Cuvee Multi-Vintage has distinctive toasty and spicy aromas. A palate of honey, almond, pastry and baked apples gives a hint of decadence. Intense yet delicate, elegant yet complex – it's no wonder it's consistently crowned one of the best English sparkling wines.

**02. Nyetimber Cuvee Cherie, N. V.**

A wine designed with food very much in mind, the Cuvee Cherie Multi-Vintage was initially made to complement delicate British desserts, but it is equally well-suited to gently spiced and fragrant savoury dishes. This cuvee has the delicate sweetness of honey notes, balanced with pure citrus lemon and tangerine flavours and a refreshing minerality. Elegant, delicate and fresh, it works particularly well with richer foods.

**03. Nyetimber Rose, N. V.**

A textured and generous rose with a core of bright red fruit, evoking the English summer. This beautiful sunset-pink multi-vintage rose has us dreaming of long, sunny days. Offering a unique combination of aromas, including British summer fruits and shortbread. Its creamy, round texture and refreshing redcurrant, raspberry and cherry flavours give it an elegant and silky finish.

40-year-old vines and stony terroir give this wine a bouquet of ripe Chardonnay, with a whiff of fresh wildflowers. On the palate, notes of stewed apple and almond butter. Deliciously fresh and tangy at the end.

**87. Bourgogne Chardonnay, Mestrel-Michelot, Cote d’Or, 2020 “Meursault”**

**£65.00**

A stone’s throw from “Meursault”, appealing richness and honeyed fruit style, notes of stewed fruits and soft cream fudge, honey, cereal and a hint of minerality. Beautifully textured palate with a steely quenching acidity.

**88. Chablis 1er Cru, Seguinot-Bordet, 2021**

**£69.00**

Grown from 45–60-year-old vines, this is one of the best Premier Cru sites in Chablis. Attractive aromas of lemon and stone fruit with hints of acacia honey. Ripe, round and forward on the palate with great structure and poise.

**89. Saint-Romain Blanc, Domaine Alain Gras, 2019**

**£78.00**

Delightful aromas of green apple, pear, peach, apricot and toasted almonds. Round, creamy and luscious underpinned by vibrant, lively acidity wrapping around a core of further white stone fruit, honey and white pepper spice.

**90. Chateau Fuisse, Tete de Cru, 2021**

**£79.00**

Slate, sandy and clay soil make this A forward and open typical “Chateau Fuisse”. Lush, polished and rich on the nose, with an appealing and balanced fresh acidity, light undertones of minerality on the finish.

**91. Auxey Duresses Vieilles Vignes, Prunier-Bonheur, 2021**

**£82.00**

Average age of 65-year-old vines produce this outstanding wine of great complexity. Intense and buttery with a highly concentrated mid-palate, with lingering stony minerality at the end. Superb!

**92. Saint-Aubin “La Pricee” Lamy, 2019**

**£93.00**

Saint Aubin village is tucked away behind Puligny Montrachet, this is Chardonnay’s spiritual home. The wines here are elegant, rich and honeyed, culminating in a lemon-zest freshness that kicks in at the end.

**93. Puligny -Montrachet “Les Houlieres” Domaine Marchand De Gramont, 2020**

**£110.00**

20-hectare family estate in Prissey, neighbouring Nuits-St-George and managed by Arnaud Machard & Sons. A melange of ripe tropical fruits, steely backbone with a touch of terroir minerality.

**94. Meursault “Les Grands Charrons” Chavy, 2020**

**£150.00**

Immediate and powerful on the nose, showing fleshy tropical fruit, honey and buttered cooking apple. Full, ripe and creamy palate is rounded and golden throughout. Great minerality and an elegant forceful character. Stunning!

**95. Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru, Louis Latour, 2017**

**£198.00**

Located Southeast of Corton for maximum exposure, the fruit is harvested as late as possible to guarantee maximum ripeness. The attractive nose has minerality with ripe peaches and subtle citrus. A palate of great weight and depth.

Vivid red colour, packed with red berries and delicate sweet spices. Smooth palate yet with a lively acidity. This is a well-balanced wine with a persistent finish.

Intense and bright ruby red in colour, aromas of plum and dark cherry combined with toasted notes of oak barrel ageing. Weighty palate with firm tannins revealing dark fruit, coffee and vanilla flavours. Great character and body.			
<b>59. Malbec Classico, Kaiken, Mendoza, Argentina</b>			<b>£35.00</b>
Rich, dark and full-bodied with mature black forest fruits and a hint of spice, married to soft vanilla flavours as a result of ageing in French oak.

Enticing aroma of both red and black fruits with underlying vanilla and tobacco tones. Full, rich and round palate with impressive elegance, thanks to the silky-smooth tannins and black fruits, roasted coffee and dark chocolate.
- 63. Pinot Noir, Domaine de Valmoissine, Louis Latour, France** £39.00  
Delicious soft and silky Pinot Noir from the Louis Latour stable. Small yields ensure bright, full-flavoured fruit. Generous acidity, subtle tannins, a very juicy red.
- 64. Teroldego, Cantina Lavis, Italy** £40.00  
Teroldego is a grape variety from Trentino, in the far northeast of Italy with the sub-Mediterranean climate of South Tyrol. Grown on the slopes of Avisio hills, ruby red with nuances of violets and small forest fruits, soft and rounded with a spacious finish.
- 65. Bonarda, Zuccardi, Mendoza, Argentina** £41.00  
Enticing bouquet of black cherry, crème de cassis and blackberry fused with hints of cedar spice. Juicy and luscious with ripe velvety tannins. Flowing into further black fruit and black pepper spice.
- 66. Cerasuolo Di Vittoria, Santa Tresa, Sicily, Italy** £41.00  
Ruby red colour with violet flecks, on the nose there are notes of morello cherries and caramel. Mouth filling palate with excellent structure, soft tannins and a long finish.

Gorgeous black cherry and plums fused with pepper, oak and hints of mocha. Multi-layered texture with a lovely purity and a smooth black fruit finish, dotted with violets and spice.

A beautiful aroma of black cherry, blackberry and a hint of leather supported by powerful yet balanced palate and a stunning finish.

**£105.00**

Ruby in colour, retains its energy and tension with notes of redcurrants, peppery garrigue and excellent minerality. This leads to a medium to full bodied and sleek wine, full of raspberries and spice with a wonderfully structured balance.

**101. Bourgogne Pinot Noir, Amphora, Domaine de Mauperthuis, 2019**

**£67.00**

Smoky summer fruits and just picked redcurrants with notes of orange peel and sandalwood. Of opulent texture, the fruit is juicy, delicate and gentle. Utterly delicious!

**102. Cotes De Nuits Village, “Le Clos de Magny” Domaine Lecheneaut, 2021**

**£73.00**

Dark, deep and limpid in colour, with an appealing and fragrant nose of ripe black fruits. Concentrated palate, full bodied with plush tannins. The sweet oak is careful and gives the wine elegance and power.

**103. Savigny Les Beaune 1er Cru “Le Serpentieres” Domaine Jean-Jaques Girard, 2020**

**£81.00**

Gentle ripeness and great structure, this is an excellent 1er Cru. Seductive and decadent nose of blackcurrant, cassis and black cherry. Great intensity and extremely well balanced, further fruit core with nutmeg and toasted oak spice.

**104. Gevrey-Chambertin Vieilles Vignes “Domaine Rossignol-Trapet” 2017**

**£87.00**
